

## Did you know that...

- The Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant (RWWTP) is operated by the City of Maryville in conjunction with the City of Alcoa who pays 45% of the Operating budget.
- The RWWTP serves the City of Maryville, City of Alcoa, parts of Blount County and Knox Chapman Utility District
- The RWWTP has a biological capacity of 10 million/gallons/day with additional treatment options to allow for treating peak wet weather flows and meeting the requirements of the *Clean Water Act*.
- Our RWWTP is at capacity and plans for expansion are currently being drawn.
- The treatment facility averaged 9.3 million/gallons/day in 2005 and removed over 2500 metric tons of dry bio-solids.
- During 2005 the lowest daily flow to the RWWTP was 6.7 million/gallons/day. The highest daily flow during 2005 was 25.3 million/gallons/day.
- During 2005 the RWWTP treated 3,383,922,000 gallons of wastewater. The wastewater plant removes Biological Oxygen Demand, Solids and other pollutants before discharge.
